Visit/Mission Title: VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Purpose of travel: To meet with senior officials, non-government agencies and research institutes from child protection and child welfare systems in New York City, Chicago and Tennessee. These three jurisdictions have significantly reduced their Out of Home Care populations over the last 10 years, whilst simultaneously improving support for families to keep children at home through the implementation and use of evidence based programs. These jurisdictions have also significantly shortened lengths of stay in care and improved rates of adoption and guardianship through outcome based contracting with their non-government partners. NSW is engaging in outcome based contracts in 2017 and the trip served to understand how those contracts have been successfully implemented, and what systemic changes have led to decreases in the number of children in Out Of Home Care.

Benefits of travel for the State of New South Wales: NSW has experienced a significant growth in the rate and number of children entering OOHC over the last 10 years. NSW also has low restoration rates and very low rates of adoption. Learning from the success of other jurisdictions' implementation of evidence based programs and outcomes based contracting, provides NSW with an opportunity to implement new service delivery approaches across the child protection continuum. NSW will recontract the service system in 2017 and this visit was timely to ensuring the best possible approach to achieve success as we work to reduce the number of children in Out Of Home Care and improve the performance of FACS and the non-government sector.
