Visit/Mission Title: VISIT TO THE UNITED KINGDOM AND DENMARK

Purpose of travel

To meet with senior officials from social and community housing, child protection and child welfare, with a particular focus on preventing young people exiting the out of home care system to homelessness and involvement in the criminal justice system and social housing.

Benefits of travel for the State of New South Wales

The United Kingdom has since 1998 through legislative, regulatory and policy initiatives, achieved success in improving the outcomes for children in care, such as reducing the numbers of children in out of home care in the criminal justice system. Lessons learnt by the UK will assist NSW in responding to similar challenges and provide a blueprint for the State's own attempts to reduce the criminalisation of children in care, an Election commitment and one of the Premier's priorities. The visit also provided valuable insight into adoption practices, which will assist in the NSW Election commitment to establish an Open Adoption Institute.

The United Kingdom and Denmark have also developed promising social and community housing initiatives designed to overcome dependence on social housing. Discussions regarding finance models, such as private sector investment and super-fund involvement in supporting community housing, as well as measures to address homelessness and social dislocation were held and will be considered in the NSW context.
