Sexual Assault



The NSW Government is investing more than \$200 million over four years for sexual assault responses across the Health, Justice and FACS clusters to respond to and support victim-survivors of sexual assault and children with sexually-harmful behaviours.

This funding is in addition to the government's investment in other services, which also respond to victims of sexual assault such as police, child protection, the Joint Investigative Response Teams, and Victims Services.

NSW was the first state in Australia to introduce a Bill paving the way to join the National Redress Scheme. The Scheme allows survivors of institutional child sexual abuse to access up to \$150,000 in compensation.
