


South West Sydney Subregion – What's the Housing Demand?

Age


- Generally the South West Sydney subregion has a younger age profile than the average for Sydney, with smaller proportions of seniors and frail aged.
- There are higher than average proportions of 0 14 year olds in this subregion, and Campbelltown, Fairfield and Liverpool also have higher proportions of 15 24 year olds. Campbelltown, Fairfield and Wollondilly have higher proportions of 50 64 year olds.
- There will be an increasing need for housing to suit seniors and frail aged, as these cohorts are forecast to increase strongly to 2031 (DPE household projections).
- The table below shows the proportion of people in each age cohort in all the South West Sydney subregion local government areas (LGAs) at the 2011 Census.



Household Type

- Couple families with children represent the largest household and family type, comprising between 40% and 47% of all households, followed by couple only and lone person households in the South West. Wollondilly and Camden have the highest proportion of couple only households and Campbelltown has the highest proportion of lone person households in the subregion.
- Couple only and lone person households combined comprise between a third and 40% of all household and family types in the South West Sydney subregion and so there is a need for housing types (with one or two bedrooms) to match the housing requirements of this fairly significant group.
- The graph below shows the proportion in each key household type at the 2011 Census for each of the South West Sydney subregion local government areas.






Household Size

- The average household size in all the South West Sydney LGAs is much higher than the Sydney average of 2.7 persons per household. Since 1996, average household size has decreased in most South West LGAs Liverpool is the exception.
- The table below shows the average household size in each of the South West Sydney subregion local government areas at 1996, 2001, 2006 and 2011.



Income

- In most of the South West subregion LGAs, low income households comprise the largest proportion of all households, the exception being Camden (where high income households comprise the largest group). Between 2006 and 2011 the proportion of low income households increased in Campbelltown, Fairfield and Liverpool. In both Camden and Wollondilly the proportion of high income earners increased over the same period.
- The graph below shows the proportion of low, moderate and high income households at the 2011 Census in all the South West Sydney subregion local government areas.



Nevertheless, the number of low income households increased in every South West LGA as the graph below demonstrates.



 Further, the number of low income renters is increasing at a faster rate than the number of low income households in most South West LGAs, as the table below demonstrates.

Homelessness

The table below shows the number of homeless people in the South West Sydney Subregion according to the 2011 Census. This is one indicator of unmet housing demand.
